

Comparing Numbers

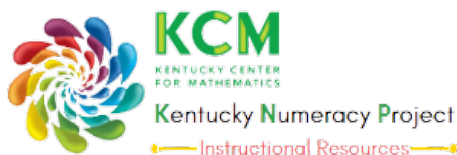
**I am learning to read and compare numerals
1-19.**

Materials:

two 0-1 number cubes (three sides labeled 0 and three sides labeled 1) and two Deca-die (10-sided dice), writing space

Directions:

1. You and your partner each roll one 0-1 number cube and one Deca-die.
2. Make a 1-digit or a 2-digit number with your dice. Use the Deca-die for the tens digit and the cube for the ones digit.
3. The student who rolled the greater number makes a comparison statement.
(For example “15 is greater than 13”)
4. The same student then writes the comparison statement.
5. The player who is first to record six comparisons is the winner.



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
