

## Comparing Numbers

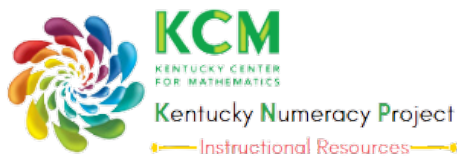
**I am learning to read and compare three-digit numbers.**

### **Materials:**

arrow cards for hundreds, tens, and ones, separated into 3 piles

### **Directions:**

1. Separate arrow cards into 3 piles (for hundreds, tens, and ones) and turn them face down.
2. You and your partner pick one arrow card from each pile.
3. Using the three arrow cards build a three-digit number. Compare that number with your partner's number.
4. The student with the greater number makes a comparison statement (**For example "875 is greater than 463"**) and writes their comparison.
5. The player who is first to record six comparisons is the winner.



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
