Game 19, Pg. 54 (Derived Fact Strategies - Addition and Subtraction)

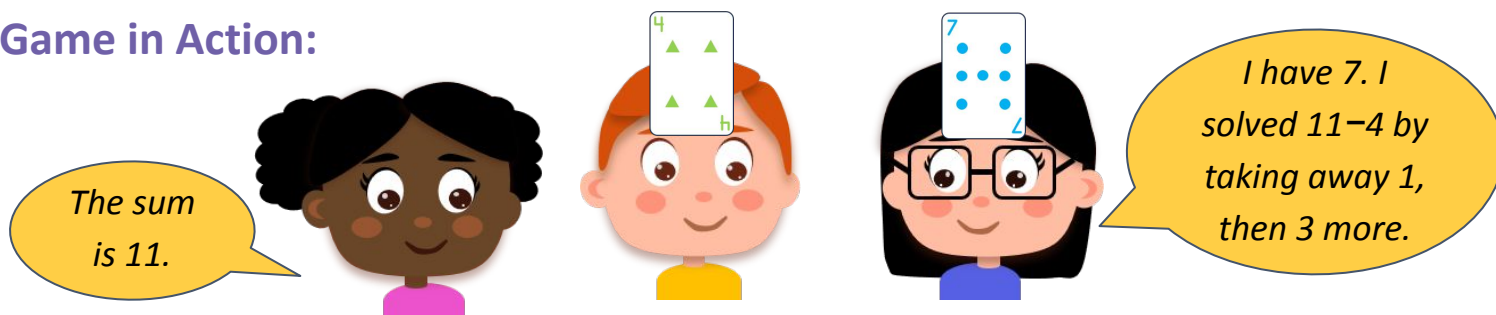
Game Goal: Win the most cards.

Materials: 0-10 deck of cards

How to Play (3 players):

1. Determine which of the three players will be the leader (the “General”) for the first draw.
2. The leader takes the deck (facedown) and hands each of the other two players a card. Players do NOT look at their own card.
3. When the leader says “Salute!”, the other two players hold their cards on their foreheads facing outward so the others can see them. The leader says the sum of the two cards.
4. The other two players determine the value of the card on their forehead, based on hearing the sum and seeing the card on the other player’s forehead (one addend). Both players share how they determined their number.
5. The first player to answer correctly keeps both cards.
6. The player to the right of the leader becomes the leader for the next round. Play continues until the deck is gone or time is up. The winner is the player with the most cards.

Game in Action:



Recording: Provide one shared recording sheet per group. On each round, the leader records the related facts. In the above example, she records $4+7=11$ or $7+4=11$, $11-4=7$, and $11-7=4$.

Variations:

- Vary range of cards (e.g. 0-5) or play with ten frame cards.
- Include another player. The leader gives the sum of all 3 cards.
- 2 players: Leader says the double sum (or combo of 10) and player determines their card.
